
General Tour


MIA Architecture Tour

Little Artist's Eye

Age group: Kindergarten - third grade (3-8 years)

Young artists will be introduced to Islamic Art and its artifacts through a tour in the galleries. They will learn about different objects, by the gesture of show and tell. First observe, outline and draw the objects using a color scheme inspired by the objects, and tell their story.



Geometry Patterns in Islamic Art

Language: Arabic/English

Age group: Primary to secondary school

Max. numbers: 30 per group

Students will be introduced to patterns in Islamic art through a brief tour in the galleries; to learn the basics of geometry, they will produce a geometric pattern using template where students construct and repeat a geometric shape, later they will paint and design their pattern using a color scheme inspired by MIA's collection. The workshop gets complex as we proceed higher with the age groups.



Sketch in the Gallery

Square Kufic



Talented in Kufic Script



Explore MIA's Galleries through Colors, Shapes, Numbers and Alphabets

While walking through our galleries they will discover Islamic art objects and collect and analyze data about objects and visitors to draw conclusions.



Arabic letters accents (Harakat) Exploring Harakat and Hamza through Islamic Art

In this gallery explorer students will discover Arabic letters and accents as a form of art and will learn

to identify different types of accents (Harakat and Hamza) in several manuscripts. They will visit the Quran gallery for a worksheet-based activity to formalize and help the students recognize the different accents, how to use them and when. They will work as teams or as individuals to present and highlight the importance of Arabic language in the Islamic art based on an object of their choice.



Treasure Hunt: let's explore Trading in the Islamic world!


MIA Travelers - in the steps of Ibn Battuta, from North Africa through Arabia and beyond


Literary art

How to write a story and Al

Age group: 9 to 12 years old

A workshop for students entitled "How to Write a Story and AI"; Starts from the intended goal of reading and writing stories to the students trying to create their own stories. Through a range of interactive activities that reflect critical thinking, teamwork, and creativity. There is also a brief demonstration of how AI can be used to generate stories and the pros and cons of this tool. At the end of the workshop, the students will have a solid foundation in story writing.



Object handling - Junior Curator

They will explore the galleries, join interactive workshops, and take part in guided activities designed to spark curiosity and a love for learning. It's a chance to experience the museum as a welcoming space that inspires exploration and creativity.



Sleep Over

Age group: Preparatory School (Grades 6-9)

(For boys only, 6 students from each of 10 schools)

This weekend program offers students a full day at the Museum of Islamic Art, ending with an overnight stay. Through engaging activities and interactive workshops, students will see the museum in a new light – a place where learning and enjoyment come together in a unique experience.



MIA Ambassador
